Coloriscombe is an ongoing creative colour challenge that started in 2022. Once a week a colour prompt is sent out to everyone who subscribes (it is free). The prompt consists of a selection of between two and five colours, picked from an artwork by an artist or designer from the past. The idea is to use these colours as a base, with the addition of a dark and light colour, to create a new artwork every week. Thousands have joined in this program, which is now in its third year. I think creativity flourishes when you are focused on using a limitation of dynamic colours, and I love seeing what people create—paintings, sketchbook and journaling, ceramics, embroidery, collage, etc. In addition to the colours, I send out a concise backstory of each featured artist. Very often these are lesser-known female artists and designers, as well as others who fall into obscurity. Get into a creative habit by doing a weekly colour project. Join in and see where they will lead you.

The journey to create this confetti vase begins with a simple white vase, forming its foundational structure. Over this frame, layers of poster sheets and papier mache were applied, gradually fashioning a sturdy, shell-like exterior. Once the vase assumed this durable form, the final step was meticulously applying the confetti.
